The 2-1-1 Texas Information and Referral Network, a statewide telecommunications network, is providing around the clock information about evacuation, shelter and general information, including: • Shelter location information, • Information about access to available medical care, such as dialysis, • Requests for food, • Requests for prescription assistance, • Requests for diapers and formula, • Information related to accessing out of state Food Stamp benefits, • Reassurance to evacuees unable to contact loved ones, and • Donation and volunteer information.

Special telecommunications routing is established to enable the twenty-five 2-1-1 centers to function as a single call center, taking calls in a round-robin fashion to ensure that hurricane callers receive priority access to a call specialist.

### ***In Texas...for refugees located in the Lone Star State*** **Food Assistance / Food Stamp Benefits**

All individuals displaced by Hurricane Katrina that come to Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) offices are being treated as applicants for expedited food stamp benefits, regardless of previous receipt of benefits in another state and other eligibility factors. HHSC has been working closely with the U. S. Department of Agriculture to implement these temporary changes. Food Stamp benefits are 100% federally funded.

Specifically:

- Because the situation makes proof of income and assets difficult, client statements are being accepted for income and other eligibility factors.
- Resources are disregarded.
- If the applicant has income but it is not accessible to him/her, the applicant may still qualify for benefits.

For those displaced individuals who have an electronic benefits card from an affected state, benefits can be accessed through Texas retailers such as HEB, Kroger, and Wal-Mart.

Louisiana has applied for a disaster declaration that will allow them to make various changes, including issuing a supplemental payment to compensate for damaged food.

The Texas Department of State Health Services is working to provide Louisiana WIC (Women, Infants, Children Program) clients access to their food and nutrition benefits in Texas.

In Houston, The Texas United Way is assisting evacuees in need of referrals for food stamps (713) 957-HELP or to the Texas Health & Human Services at (800) 500-4266.

Red Cross continues to have 25 shelters open in the Greater Houston area to help disaster victims forced from their homes by Hurricane Katrina. The Red Cross sheltered 2,049 evacuees overnight and George R Brown (City of Houston) sheltered approx 1,083 last night.

A hot food waiver has been approved for the six federally declared counties of Mobile, Baldwin, Clarke, Choctaw, Sumter and Washington. This means that food stamp recipients in these counties may use their benefits to purchase prepared food.

***WHAT IS THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DOING TO SUPPORT HOUSING  
IN THIS CRISIS?***

\*\* The US Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has established a toll-free number for the public and its employees to get information on HUD operations. Call 1-866-641-8102.

\*\* On Wednesday, September 7, HUD Established a Single Toll-Free Number (1-888-297-8685) To Help Disaster Victims With All Housing Concerns Assistance available from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., CST, seven days a week.

\*\* The office of Housing issued, on August 31, 2005, a mortgagee letter reminding lenders of the 203(h) disaster program and encouraging servicers to delay foreclosure in counties declared federal disaster areas and to consider hurricane damage in the context of any requests for loss mitigation assistance.

\*\* HUD will identify vacant multi-family housing, public housing units, and HUD-owned homes in 500-mile radius of the affected areas that can be used as housing. If you are a current recipient of HUD housing assistance, contact HUD (above) for support and referral.

\*\* Disaster voucher assistance is available for any family rendered homeless.

\*\* Vouchers for replacement units for displaced public housing families or displaced residents living in other HUD multifamily projects are also available.

\*\* LOUISIANA, note that all HUD operations performed out of the New Orleans, LA Field Office have been devolved to the Ft. Worth Regional Office.

**\*\* The federal government is planning temporary housing for as many as 300,000 families in the Gulf Coast region—the bulk of which will be travel trailers and mobile homes in Louisiana. Families should register for temporary housing by contacting the agency at 800-621-FEMA (3362).**

**\*\* IHP, which may include cash grants of up to \$26,200 per individual or household, provides services to people in the disaster area when losses are not covered by insurance, and property has been damaged or destroyed. Register for assistance by calling the agency at 800-621-FEMA (3362).**

## **Medications/Medical Needs**

NOTE: Many people living with serious mental illness are reliant on Medicaid for their services, supports, and treatment. For others, access to treatment is a critical component of their health, a condition that may likely be compromised with the tragedy of Hurricane Katrina.

### ***U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services What consumers and families need to know.....***

- \*\* Health care providers that furnish medical services in good faith, but who cannot comply with normal program requirements because of Hurricane Katrina, will be paid for services provided and will be exempt from sanctions for noncompliance, unless it is discovered that fraud or abuse occurred.
- \*\* Crisis services provided to Medicare and Medicaid patients who have been transferred to facilities not certified to participate in the programs will be paid.
- \*\* Medicare contractors may pay the costs of ambulance transfers of patients being evacuated from one health care facility to another.
- \*\* Normal prior authorization and out-of-network requirements will also be waived for enrollees of Medicare, Medicaid, or SCHIP managed care programs.
- \*\* Normal licensing requirements for doctors, nurses, and other health care professionals who cross state lines to provide emergency care in stricken areas will be waived as long as the provider is licensed in their home state.
- \*\* Certain HIPPA privacy requirements will be waived so that health care providers can talk to family members about a patient's condition even if that patient is unable to grant that permission to the provider.
- \*\* Hospitals and other facilities can be flexible in billing for beds that have been dedicated to other uses, for example, if a psychiatric unit bed is used for an acute care patient or vice versa.
- \*\* Hospital emergency rooms will not be held liable under the Emergency Medical Treatment and Labor Act (EMTALA) for transferring patients to other facilities for assessment, if the original facility is in the area where a public health emergency has been declared.

## **PRIVATE INSUREREDS**

\*\* Contact your insurance company or benefits manager as soon as possible and determine alternative arrangements for your care and service.

\*\* Contact the NAMI state organization in your relocated state for local resources and referrals to provider services that meet the needs of people living with serious mental illness.

## **MEDICAID**

\*\* If you are a Medicaid recipient who has evacuated to another state, your Medicaid benefits will still apply as long as you are treated by an out-of-state provider who is willing to accept your state's Medicaid as payment. For information on securing a transfer of this benefit, call 1-888-342-6207 and for pharmacy benefits related to Medicaid, call 1-800-437-9101.

\*\* If you routinely had your prescriptions filled by a national pharmacy chain (Walgreens, CVS, etc.) your information is in their system. You can go to any store and they will have your history and be able to assist with refills. Take your former prescription bottle to the pharmacy with you for assistance with a refill.

\*\* In the likely event that you do not have access to your regular doctor or clinic and you do not have any refills available, or you do not have access at all to your former medication, find a provider in your relocated area and schedule an appointment. If you have them, take your former prescription(s) with you to a new provider so he/she can have access to at least some of your treatment information. Having a family member or friend present, if possible, will also help to relay previous history to ensure best results.

\*\* For medical pharmacy program benefits, please go to a pharmacy that accepts Medicaid benefits with your Medicaid card and/or call Medicaid at 1-888-342-6207 for temporary enrollment.

\*\* NOTE that Medicaid rules are being laxed for displaced Medicaid recipients and that different states are responding with various strategies. Read below for more detailed information about your current location's policies.

### ***LOUISIANA RESIDENTS, DID YOU KNOW?***

\*\* If you are a displaced resident of Louisiana, have your former prescription bottle, and are in need of mental health medications, please contact 1-225-922-2700 and/or read below for additional information.

\*\* If your medical provider is unsure of how to get your prescriptions filled in other areas, ask them to call 1-800-437-9101 (in Louisiana) or out of state at 1-225-342-1590.

\*\* If your medical provider has questions relating to your benefits or other issues relating to your Medicaid benefits, they can call 1-800-473-2783 (in or out of state).

\*\* People specifically looking for help with patients in nursing homes, hospitals who need to evacuate, or other care units, call 1-225-763-5749.

### ***ALABAMA RESIDENTS, DID YOU KNOW?***

#### **Medicaid and SCHIP Cross State Coordination For Hurricane Katrina Evacuees**

States affected by Hurricane Katrina are working with CMS to develop procedures for handling Medicaid and SCHIP enrollment and benefit issues.

## **Current Medicaid and SCHIP Enrollees**

Enrollees should remain in the program they are currently enrolled.

Ex: A Louisiana (LA) Medicaid enrollee in Alabama (AL) will remain enrolled in LA Medicaid.

For Medicaid, *providers* will need to enroll in the network of the state from which the recipient is enrolled, i.e. Alabama providers need to enroll in the LA and Mississippi (MS) Medicaid network to be reimbursed for treating these enrollees.

LA SCHIP (LaCHIP) is a Medicaid expansion, enrollee and provider issues are the same as for Medicaid. LA Medicaid eligibility can be checked through the Alabama Medicaid web site. Provider network application for both the Alabama and LA networks are also available at that site.

MS SCHIP is a stand alone program utilizing the Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS) of MS network. Out of state providers should call BCBS of MS @ (877) 870-3110 for approval of services. ALL Kids has asked BCBS of AL to help facilitate getting these children services as needed.

For ALL Kids enrollees who have evacuated to other states, BCBS of AL will pay out of state claims for ALL Kids enrollees with a county of residence of Baldwin, Choctaw, Mobile, Sumter, Clarke and Washington. This measure has been put in place until September 30, 2005 and will be extended if needed.

*Uninsured Evacuees who may be eligible for Medicaid or SCHIP.* Residents from other states who are in AL temporarily, who may now be eligible for Medicaid or SCHIP, need to be enrolled in the program of their state of residence. There is an expedited process and form being developed for this purpose.

If the family will be staying in AL permanently, then they may apply for AL Medicaid or ALL Kids using the joint application.

REGARDING MEDS IN ALABAMA....The Board of Pharmacy will be closely monitoring Hurricane Katrina and its effect on pharmacy services throughout the state. Many people will be without pharmacy services in the worst hit areas. The Board will ask that in the event that an individual is unable to obtain their medication from their usual pharmacy during this emergency situation, that you apply the Emergency Prescription Refill criteria.

680-X-2-.26 Emergency Prescription Refill

1. If a pharmacist received a request for a personal prescription refill, the original of which is maintained in the pharmacy files, and the pharmacist is unable to readily obtain refill authorization from the prescriber, the pharmacist may

dispense a one-time emergency refill of up to a 72 hour supply of the prescribed medication, provided that:

- a. The prescription is not a medicinal agent listed in Schedule II appearing in Title 20 Chapter 2.
- b. The prescription is not a medicinal agent listed in Schedule III appearing in Title 20 Chapter 2.
- c. The medication is essential to the maintenance of life or the continuation of therapy in a chronic condition.

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### ***DISPLACED LOUISIANA RESIDENTS IN TEXAS, DID YOU KNOW?***

\*\*Louisiana officials are enrolling Texas pharmacies as Louisiana providers, allowing Louisiana Medicaid recipients to access medications. To enroll, pharmacies will need to fax in enrollment forms posted at <http://www.hhsc.state.tx.us/HCF/vdp/vdpstart.html>. Pharmacies needing to verify eligibility can do so by calling 1-800-473-2783. Texas is broadcasting this information both through HHSC and the Texas Pharmacy Association. In addition, health care providers can verify the Medicaid and CHIP enrollment information for individuals from Louisiana and obtain procedures to process claims by calling 1-800-473-2783.

Alabama Medicaid providers should feel confident regarding reimbursement of services to displaced Medicaid recipients from Louisiana and Mississippi. Please note that providers will be paid based on out-of-state coverage policies established by the Medicaid programs in those state.

**A.** To be eligible for the Card, you must:

- o Not be eligible for Medicare
- o Have no public or private prescription drug coverage
- o Have household income equal to or less than \$30,000 for a single person and \$60,000 for a family of four (income eligibility adjusted for family size)\*\*
- o Be a legal resident of the US or Puerto Rico

### ***DISPLACED LOUISIANA AND MISSISSIPPI CITIZENS IN TEXAS, DID YOU KNOW?***

Regarding nursing home relocations....The Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services is coordinating the use of available nursing facility beds on an as needed basis. Several residents of Louisiana facilities have already relocated to nursing facilities in Texas. The Area Agencies on Aging are providing information on shelter and other assistance. Regarding children in residential treatment facilities and foster care.....The Department of Family and Protective Services is expediting the issuance of a license for a residential treatment facility in Corpus Christi to serve children in a New Orleans facility with serious behavioral problems. Forty-nine children from this facility are currently housed in a school gymnasium in Baton Rouge. In addition, families and facilities in Louisiana serving foster children have contacted DFPS requesting assistance. To meet this need, DFPS is identifying available spaces in Day or Residential Care facilities, and they are encouraging and assisting providers to serve displaced children. DFPS will actively monitor placements in foster homes or facilities to ensure the safety of these children.
