What's Happening in NAMI Education

NAMI Basics: Teacher trainings have been completed in the first nine states selected to bring NAMI Basics to their communities: California, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, New Jersey, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Utah. A total of 139 parents or other primary caregivers have been trained to teach the program in their state, nineteen classes have been completed. Nine additional states will host teacher trainings in the fall: Arkansas, Arizona, Florida, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Montana and Wisconsin.



Family-to-Family: At Training of Trainers, Family-to-Family trained 53 trainers from 25 states. Family support group graduated 35 trainers from 17 states, Virgin Islands, and British Columbia, Canada.

In Our Own Voice (IOOV): In Our Own Voice just completed the annual Training of Trainers in April, graduating 26 new IOOV state trainers from 17 different states. This year at Convention, we will offer a demonstration IOOV presentation with tips on how to get the program started in states/affiliates. We will also be premiering the IOOV Spanish video at the Institute during Convention.

Peer-to-Peer: Peer to Peer has completed three pilots for the Persona a Persona Spanish recovery course. The final pilot class will be taking off soon in New York City. We also recently launched our Class Listing System, which will allow people to view upcoming classes in their area on the Peer to Peer website: www.nami.org/p2p.
