#### **Training of Trainers In St. Louis**

### **Interested in being a Connection Mentor?**

A mentor must be a certified NAMI Connection facilitator willing to work closely with a person from the group who has received a Provisional Certificate at a state or national training, or a group member who has not attended training but is willing to serve in an assisting position.

Mentoring develops the skills necessary to assist someone in the facilitator role until that person can become a certified facilitator themselves. Dedicated mentors assure the person being mentored is able to understand how to facilitate a group according to fidelity through gentle advising, counseling and instructing. Helping and supporting the person in a trusting, non-threatening manner is an important factor. It empowers them to move forward with confidence.

Good mentoring will create a relaxed environment in which the person being mentored can feel encouraged to discuss their needs.
