On behalf of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), I am writing in support of confirmation of Chiquita Brooks-LaSure as the next Administrator of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). NAMI values Ms. Brooks-LaSure's unparalleled health policy expertise, and her commitment to helping Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries, many of whom have mental health conditions.

As the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental illness, NAMI fights for policy change that translates our mission into reality, including promoting early intervention, improving access to quality mental health care and diverting from criminal justice involvement. COVID-19 is an unprecedented crisis that affects not only our physical health and daily lives, but also our mental health. We need a CMS administrator who will work to ensure that people in need of mental health and substance use disorder care are able to access services when and where they need it.
